### **Alayna McClain of Bermudian Springs High School Wins PNA Foundation, AT&T It Can Wait Editorial Contest**

HARRISBURG, Pa., February 15, 2019 – Alayna McClain, a senior at Bermudian Springs High School, York Springs, is the 2019 winner of the Pennsylvania NewsMedia Association Foundation’s “It Can Wait” editorial contest.

McClain receives a \$500 cash prize to be awarded on April 3, in conjunction with the PNA Foundation’s Student Keystone Press Awards luncheon during the America East News Media and Technology Summit in Hershey, Pa.

Since 2015, the PNA Foundation, along with PNA and PNA member newspapers, has partnered with AT&T to host an “It Can Wait” editorial contest to raise awareness about the dangers of distracted driving. High school students are asked to write a column or editorial that best answers the question, “Why is it important to take the It Can Wait pledge to drive distraction free?”

Beginning last fall, PNA members hosted local contests and encouraged high school students to help to make our roadways safer for Pennsylvanians. A winner was recognized in each community and entered in the statewide contest, which drew close to 125 entries from across the state. McClain was recognized by the *Gettysburg Times*.

In selecting McClain as the Pennsylvania winner, judges commented, “Alayna’s essay stood out for her creative use of minutes to tell a powerful story. It was succinctly well-written yet memorable and moving. Her work is worthy of recognition for making an impassioned plea to consider the loss of an entire future during a four-minute drive.”

Additional students were recognized with second and third place awards. Keiko Grove, a home-schooled senior from Mill Creek, Pa., receives second place honors, while Paige Mitchell, a Tri-Valley High School student, places third. Grove, Mitchell and their parents are invited to the Student Keystone Press Awards luncheon where they will receive cash prizes and framed certificates.

Distracted driving is involved in hundreds of thousands of vehicle crashes each year, often involving injuries and death. Despite knowing the risks, nearly nine ten people admit to using their smartphones while driving and four in ten drivers call distracted driving a habit.

“It Can Wait” is a national movement urging drivers to visit [www.ItCanWait.com](http://www.ItCanWait.com), where they can pledge to keep their eyes on the road, not on their phone, and share their pledges via Twitter (#ItCanWait) and Facebook. Since its launch in 2010, the campaign has helped increase awareness of the dangers of texting while driving to about 90 percent for all audiences surveyed and inspired more than 30 million pledges not to text and drive.
