

SUNSHINE ACT

How to object to a violation

If you believe the Sunshine Act has been or will be violated, the law allows you to raise an objection at any time during a public meeting. Like other public comments, an objection should be noted in the meeting minutes.

How to object to a possible violation of the Sunshine Act:

(Mr. or Madame Chairman): I am ______, a journalist with ______ news organization. I object to the closing of this meeting. The reason for closing the meeting does not meet the provisions of Pennsylvania's Sunshine Act. I ask that you reconsider your intent to exclude the public. I further request that this objection be recorded in the official minutes of the meeting, as required by law.
